Early Intervention is:

Early Childhood Special Education Teachers working in a multi-disciplinary team with Therapists and other professionals to provide individualised service to children with Challenged ability and their family. Educators work with children aged 0 to 6 years of age. Children with a diagnosed Autism Spectrum Disorder 0 to 7 years of age.



Young & District Early Intervention offer:

- Individual programs of education and family support
- Speech and Language development
- Occupational Therapy
- Assessments of children's development including reviews and ongoing support
- Links with other services to achieve integration within the community,
- A transition to school program
- Playgroups
