# I AM PREGNANT – WHAT NEXT?

## **CONGRATULATIONS** on your pregnancy.

The Young midwives and doctors are looking forward to providing you with the best possible care throughout your pregnancy, labour, birth and early parenting. Below are answers to some commonly asked questions?

### **I am pregnant, what do I do?**

Your doctor will confirm your pregnancy, and then discuss your pregnancy care.

Unless you want to see a doctor only, your pregnancy care visits will be shared between midwives at the hospital and your doctor.

### **Will I have to pay?**

The Pregnancy Care Program is free for holders of Medicare cards. You may have to pay for your visits with your doctor. If this is a problem you should discuss it with your doctor at the time of your visit. You may also choose to use your private health insurance for your hospital stay.

### **How do I contact a doctor?**

Phone their surgery for an appointment. Numbers listed opposite.

### **How do I make appointments with the midwives at the Pregnancy Care Program?**

### **Do I have any other options for pregnancy care at Young Health Service?**

Yes – you can see your own GP if they offer pregnancy care and also one of the doctors from the opposite list, at certain times during your pregnancy. This is because they will care for you when you come into hospital for the birth of your baby.

If your pregnancy is considered “high risk” you may receive shared care between carers in Young and a Specialist Obstetrician.

After giving birth, the local Child and Family Team can provide follow up for you and your baby.
